

**MINUTES OF A WORK SESSION OF THE CLARKSVILLE
TOWN COUNCIL HELD ON MARCH 20, 2018**

A work session of the Clarksville Town Council was called to order on March 20, 2018 at 7:33 P.M. in the Council Chambers of the Clarksville Municipal Center Administration Building by Council President Paul Fetter who chaired the meeting.

Council members present: Paul Fetter, Tim Hauber, John Gilkey, David Worrall, Aaron Stonecipher, and Jennifer Voignier. Absent: David Fisher.

Presentation by Communities in Schools of Clark County

Julie Moorman, Executive Director of Communities in Schools, came before the Council and presented a description and purpose of their program. Program services included, but were not limited to tutoring, counseling by a licensed therapist, free vision screenings, academic assistance, extended day learning, and before and after school programs. Ms. Moorman made a request to the Council to consider investing in the program in the amount of \$5000.00. Discussion was held. No action was taken at this time.

Discussion of Renewal of Interlocal Agreement with Clark County Solid Waste

Town Attorney Chris Sturgeon addressed the Council regarding renewing the Interlocal Agreement with Clark County Solid Waste. Discussion was held and Attorney Sturgeon was advised to bring to the next Council meeting for a vote.

Discussion of Progress Way Apartment Project

Planning Director Jacob Arbital came before the Council to advise them of an apartment complex plan that is at the beginning stages in the Planning Department. Mr. Arbital stated the plan currently consists of three (3) six (6) story buildings, with 106 units each. This plan has been discussed briefly with TRC. Discussion was held regarding the number of current apartment vacancies, the 6 story building factor and any issues it may cause, as well as parking issues. Council decided more information was needed before a decision could be made. Mr. Arbital advised he would gather more details regarding this project.

Discussion of Property to be temporarily used for Parking Cars by Ford Motor Company

Discussion was held regarding the matter of Ford Motor Company wishing to lease property in the Town for the purpose of parking newly manufactured vehicles. Discussion was held regarding zoning ordinances that would be affected, the amount of acreage required, temporary fencing issues, and securing the property. Council decided further discussion would be required and no action was taken at this time.

Adjournment... There being no further business to come before the Council at this time, on a motion made by Council Member Gilkey, seconded by Council Member Voignier, and carried by 6-0 vote, the March 20, 2018 work session of the Clarksville Town Council adjourned at 8:40 p.m.
