

MINUTES OF A WORK SESSION OF THE CLARKSVILLE TOWN
COUNCIL HELD ON FEBRUARY 18, 2020

A work session of the Clarksville Town Council was called to order on February 18, 2020 at 6:00 P.M. in the Executive Conference Room of the Clarksville Municipal Center Administration Building by Council President Ryan Ramsey who chaired the meeting.

Council members present: Ryan Ramsey, Tim Hauber, John Gilkey, Mike Mustain, Karen Henderson, Jennifer Voignier and Aaron Stonecipher (in at 6:43).

Presentation of Wastewater and Stormwater Study for Parkwood Neighborhood

Rob Huckaby of QK4 came before the Council and presented an overview of the Stormwater Study for Parkwood neighborhood. Mr. Huckaby advised 77 full inspections were completed. Mr. Huckaby gave an overview of the infrastructure and drainage issues. Significant findings: standing water, infrequent inlets, undersized pipes, curb ramps and driveway blockages, and easement infringement. Recommendations are as follows: Curbing repairs, increase inlet capacity, increase conveyance capacity, clearing backyard easements, and developing a drainage policy. Mr. Huckaby suggested doing projects in two tiers over the next several years to complete the projects. Mr. Huckaby suggested prioritizing the areas which need the most urgent attention and work in Tier 1 and the important, but not urgent areas into Tier 2. Discussion was held. No action taken at this meeting.

Greg Miller of Heritage Engineering came before the Council and presented an overview of the Sanitary Sewer evaluation of the Parkwood neighborhood. From the inspections completed, Mr. Miller stated the significant findings were: sump pumps connected to the system, cracks and roots in pipes, undersized pipes and offset joints. Mr. Miller stated this adds strain and maintenance to the pump and wastewater collection system. Recommendations are as follows: develop a program or policy for disconnecting groundwater and surface water from the sanitary sewers, lateral replacements, and lining to reduce I&I, backflow preventers, man-hole lid inserts, pipe maintenance and replacement. Discussion was held. No action taken at this meeting.

A draft report will be submitted in March or early April, with the need to finalize and prioritize a 10 year improvement plan.

Adjournment... There being no further business to come before the Council at this time, on a motion made by Council Member Voignier, seconded by Council Member Henderson, and carried by 7-0 vote, the February 18, 2020 work session of the Clarksville Town Council adjourned at 6:51 p.m.
