## MINUTES OF A WORK SESSION OF THE CLARKSVILLE TOWN COUNCIL HELD ON MAY 5, 2020

A work session of the Clarksville Town Council was called to order on May 5, 2020 at 7:50 P.M. the meeting room of the Clarksville Municipal Center Administration Building by Council President Ryan Ramsey, who chaired the meeting.

Council members present: Ryan Ramsey, Karen Henderson, Tim Hauber and Mike Mustain. In compliance with Governor Holcomb's Executive Orders for Coronavirus 19, the Town Council is offering teleconferencing. Present via teleconferencing: Jennifer Voignier, Aaron Stonecipher and John Gilkey.

## <u>Discussion of Allowances of Certain Farm Animals and Bee Apiaries and the Necessary</u> Amendments to the Zoning and Animal Control Ordinances

Discussion was held on several topics of this Ordinance; Council Member Stonecipher presented this list of concerns.

- -910002: Define "indoor pets" so as to include pot-belly pigs
- -91.005: discussion regarding the allowance of community/feral cats; discussion was held regarding the ecological and ornithological reasons. Further discussion was held regarding the Clark County Animal Shelter required the allowance of community cats, and would not sign a contract with the Town unless the Town agreed.
- -91.020: discussion was held regarding the permits to last 24 months instead of 12 months; further discussion was held to include an apiary permit fee in Appendix A of the ordinance.
- -91.037: allow for hutched rabbits to be used privately for meat and fur, in reference to the portion of the ordinance regarding no mutilation of any animals.
- -91.041: discussion was held regarding daytime tethering of outdoor dogs being allowed so long as food, water and shelter are appropriately provided. Further discussion was held regarding the length of time a dog should be tethered.
- -91.080: discussion was held to allow residents to have four dogs without a permit; further discussion was held regarding the total number of animals/pets
- -91.181: discussion was held regarding the permit for chicken coops to last 24 months.
- -91-182: fees and renewals on chicken coops;
- -91.183: discussion was to strike the language all-together.

Additional discussion was held regarding the permitting/licensing fees and the limitations thereof; inspections and nuisance calls; restraints required for such animals; Staff will take all

comments and Manager Baity will send out in the weekly report, and then depending on feedback, will prepare an ordinance or have further discussion.

## <u>Discussion regarding Best Practices Town Sponsored Events during the Covid-19</u> Pandemic

4<sup>th</sup> of July Concert: At this time, due to lack of ability to practice, difficulty scheduling a location and for the general health of the public, the 4<sup>th</sup> of July Concert will be cancelled. Council Member Stonecipher will be handling the Memorial Day Service virtually this year. Council Member Voignier advised a decision would hopefully be made about ClarkFest at the next meeting.

<u>Adjournment</u>... There being no further business to come before the Council at this time, a motion was made to adjourn by Council Member Mustain, seconded by Council Member Hauber, and carried by a 7-0 vote, the May 5, 2020 work session of the Clarksville Town Council adjourned at 9:06 P.M.
