

**MINUTES OF A WORK SESSION OF THE CLARKSVILLE TOWN COUNCIL
HELD ON OCTOBER 20, 2020**

A work session of the Clarksville Town Council was called to order on October 20, 2020 at 8:33 P.M. the Executive Conference Room room of the Clarksville Municipal Building by Council President Ryan Ramsey, who chaired the meeting.

Council members present: Ryan Ramsey, Tim Hauber, Mike Mustain, Jennifer Voignier, Aaron Stonecipher, Karen Henderson and John Gilkey.

Update on EMS Situation

Chief Skaggs came before the Council and updated them on the EMS situation. Chief Skaggs advised he believes the County will ask Clarksville for use of their LOIT money to help fund the County's EMS Services, in much the same manner as the Town supports 911. Chief Skaggs was directed to get further information on Clarksville providing their own EMS Services. No action taken at this meeting.

Continue Discussion on Renaming Woerner Avenue and naming the new South Clarksville Area Streets

Further discussion was held regarding naming Woerner Avenue, as well as new discussion on the new surrounding streets. After discussion was held, a general consensus of the Council was to rename Woerner Avenue to Main Street, and the surrounding street with the names of the Lewis and Clark Expedition members. No action taken at this meeting, but it was decided that names would be changed before any businesses went in so as to save them money, time and effort of a change of address.

Discussion of North End Sewer Access

Utility Director Montgomery came before the Council to discuss access to sewer easements on the North End, in order to maintain them. Further discussion was held regarding adding a trail, at the cost of the Town, and meeting with residents at HOA meetings or neighborhood meetings in the form of public meetings, to get their input on the issue. No action was taken at this meeting.

Discussion of Veteran's Day Events

Council Member Stonecipher initiated discussion on this year's Veteran's Day Events. Council Member Stonecipher advised schools were not participating in outside music, and at this time he had no fully committed musicians, due to the lack of rehearsal, due to COVID, for this year's program. Further discussion was held regarding an open-house/drive-thru type of event, where music could be played on speakers, flags set up as usual, and people could listen from the comfort and safety of their cars. The Police Department also plans to do a Flag Ceremony and discussion was held regarding the Boy Scouts doing a flag retirement ceremony. Council Member Stonecipher and Town Manager Baity will comprise a plan and make it public. No action taken at this meeting.
