

MINUTES OF A WORK SESSION OF THE CLARKSVILLE TOWN COUNCIL
HELD ON DECEMBER 7, 2021

A work session of the Clarksville Town Council was called to order on December 17, 2021, at 8:25 P.M. in the meeting room of the Clarksville Municipal Center Administration Building by Council President Ryan Ramsey, who chaired the meeting.

Council members present: Ryan Ramsey, A.D. Stonecipher, Karen Henderson, Mike Mustain, Tim Hauber, Jennifer Voignier and John Gilkey.

Presentation by the Historical Preservation Commission regarding the Annual Report for 2021 and the Proposed Work Plan for 2022

Lynn Lewis came before the Council to give the Annual Report from the Historical Preservation Commission to the Council. Ms. Lewis listed 11 accomplishments completed in 2021, gave an oversight of Designated Historic Districts, Clarksville's Historic Neighborhoods, Securing the Town's Archives, and Clarksville's 100 Year Old Homes. Ms. Lewis also submitted a proposed 2022 Budget, outlining which projects would be included in that amount, as well as requesting an increase in Commission Members. The Commission is requesting a commitment from the Town in the amount of \$56,100.00 for the 2022 Budget. No action taken at this meeting. Both Presentations are available for review in greater detail at the Clerk Treasurer's Office.

Update on George Rogers Clark Bell Tower

Council Member Tim Hauber gave an update on the George Rogers Clark Bell Tower stating that the Safe Harbor Church needs to have it removed. Discussion was held regarding relocating it to the Heritage Trail, using stones and pavers, and overlooking Colgate Park. Council Member Hauber advised costs would most likely be high to move the Bell Tower and the Town needs to decide on the amount of money they want to spend on this project. No action taken at this meeting.

Presentation on Fire Inspection Position

Fire Marshal Brent Wilson came before the Council for a Presentation on the Fire Inspection Position. Mr. Wilson gave an overview of the qualifications and requirements necessary to do this job. Further discussion was held regarding the workload of this position, the average amount of time it takes to complete the tasks involved, and all of the skills required to complete the job. The Fire Department is requesting an amendment to the Salary Ordinance to promote from within for this position. The position requires a minimum rank of a Sergeant to qualify, and that employee would then be promoted to Captain. No action taken at this meeting.
