A meeting of the Clarksville Town Council was called to order on August 2, 2022 at 7:01 P.M. in the meeting room of the Clarksville Municipal Center Administration Building by Council President, Ryan Ramsey, who chaired the meeting.

-Swearing in of Fire Fighters -Judge James Guilfoyle conducted the swearing in of Dylan Abrahamson, Steven Underwood and Kendall White. Fire Chief Brandon Skaggs presented their badges.

Consent Agenda:

-Approval of the Town Current & Pre-written, WW/SW Current & Pre-written, Bonds, Grants and Payroll.

-Minutes of the Joint Council Regular Meeting, Work Session and Executive Session held on July 19, 2022.

Council Member Gilkey made a motion to add a claim to pay for the 4th of July Celebration and approve the Consent Agenda. Council Member Hauber seconded the motion and was carried by 7-0 vote.

NEW BUSINESS

Ordinance 2022-Z-07 Rezoning 554, 570, 602, 604 & 606 Kopp Lane.

Staff recommends the Town approve Ordinance 2022-Z-07 rezoning the properties on Kopp Ln. from Eastern Blvd Corridor Zone to Business 2. Council member Henderson made a motion to approve Ordinance 2022-Z-07. Council Member Gilkey seconded the motion and was carried by a 7-0 vote.

Resolution 2022-R-21 For the Acquisition of Properties for Ring Road:

Staff recommends the Town approve Ordinance 2019-R-21 to declare eminent domain to acquire property for a street now known as Ring Rd. Council Member Gilkey made a motion to approve Ordinance 2022-R-21. Council Member Stonecipher seconded and was carried by a 6-1 vote with Council Member Voignier voting nay.

Approval to Replace Veterans Parkway Corridor Street Lights:

Staff recommends replacing the outdated streetlights on Veterans Pkwy. Duke has recommended a new standard of lights. Council Member Henderson made a motion to approve the replacement of streetlights. Council Member Voignier seconded the motion and was carried by a 6-1 vote with Council Member Stonecipher voted nay.

Acceptance of Conflict of Interest Statements:

-Staff recommends the Town accept the conflict of interest statement received from Council Member Hauber. Council Member Mustain made a motion to accept the Conflict of Interest Statement. Council Member Voignier seconded and was carried by a 6-0-1 vote with Council Member Hauber abstaining.

Approval of Additional Funding for Property Improvement Program Applicant – 111 Beckett:

Staff recommends funding the Property Improvement Program to match fund up to \$5000 for improvements to property at 111 Beckett Street. Council Member Stonecipher called for discussion regarding the additional funding for 111 Beckett Street. Further discussion was held, and Council Member Stonecipher made a motion to approve additional funding but amending the amount to \$3000.00. There was no second on the floor and the motion died. Council President Ramsey made a motion to approve additional funding in the amount of \$5952.00. Council Member Henderson seconds and the motion which carried by a 3-2-2 vote with Council Members Hauber and Mustain abstaining and Council Members Stonecipher and Gilkey voting nay.
